**Message** Hi Everyone, earlier I wrote a few questions but they didn't get registered, so I will try to rewrite them.

I appreciate your entertaining my questions and concerns.

I had been told I would find information on your webpage about what the duties are of the Police and Fire Departments, thus dictating how large a department should be. Where can I find that information? I was curious to read in your report that you expect the Town to grow by roughly 365 people in the next 20 years but plan to double the size of both Police and Fire. How do you equate the disparity?

In reading your report about common space, I noticed areas not mentioned that might be considered to save space and money. For example, one set for women and one for men: bathrooms, lockers, showers and sleeping arrangements. Then, generally, one: kitchen, common eating area, writing-of-reports area, common tables, and th like. Perhaps you can name other areas that could be common ones.
